Nicholas Guntrip-Hook

Thalictrum petaloideum 'Ghent Ebony' is another key plant in the garden and a newer cultivar, bred by the *Thalictrum* expert Sandrine Delabroye, with fern-like deep purple, almost black foliage and contrasting white flowers. It's one of many favourites looked after by Nicholas Guntrip-Hook in his Collection.

Caulophyllum thalictroides

Blue Cohosh is a woodland perennial with a single smooth stem, lacy blue-green divided leaves, and small greenish-yellow spring flowers. It produces striking bright blue, berry-like seeds in late summer. Native to eastern North America, it grows in moist, shaded forests and prefers rich, humus-filled soil.

Thalictrum actaeifolium

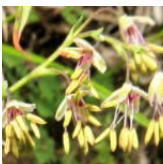
A clump-forming perennial with lobed leaves that emerge bronze-purple in spring and rise on stems to about 80 cm. In summer it bears small, fluffy flowers composed of lavender-to-white stamens. Deciduous, preferring moist, humus-rich soil in partial shade, it grows in woodland or shaded garden settings.

***Thalictrum actaeifolium* 'Perfume Star'**

Thalictrum 'Perfume Star' is a compact, free-flowering meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and upright stems carrying soft lilac-pink, lightly scented flowers in early summer. Reaching 60–90 cm, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade. A charming cultivar valued for its delicate fragrance, airy texture, and reliable border performance.

Thalictrum actaeifolium* var. *brevistylum

A compact woodland perennial forming upright clumps with divided blue-green leaves and short, branching stems. In early summer it produces soft, airy clusters of pink-lavender flowers with prominent white-tipped stamens. Preferring moist, humus-rich soil in partial shade, this Korean variety offers delicate texture and gentle colour in shaded borders or naturalistic plantings.

Thalictrum alpinum

A tiny, tufted alpine perennial forming mounds of blue-green, finely divided basal leaves. Short, leafless stems rise in late spring to early summer, carrying small nodding flowers with green-purple sepals and long purple stamens tipped with yellow. Growing 5–25 cm tall, it inhabits cold, moist alpine or subarctic slopes, bogs, and rocky ledges.

***Thalictrum* 'Anne'^{PBR}**

A tall, elegant meadow-rue with purple stems, blue-green lacy foliage, and round purple-pink buds that open into airy clusters of white sepals with creamy stamens in summer. Reaching 1.5–2.5 m, it forms an upright, clump-forming habit. Thrives in moist, humus-rich, well-drained soil in partial shade, adding height, movement, and soft colour to borders.

Thalictrum aquilegifolium

A vigorous, bushy perennial to about 1–1.5 m, with attractively divided blue-green leaves resembling columbine foliage. In late spring to early summer it bears dense, fluffy clusters of pink, purple, or white flowers held on upright stems, the showy effect created by masses of stamens. Preferring moist, humus-rich, well-drained soil in partial shade, it brings soft texture, height, and movement to borders and woodland plantings.

Thalictrum aquilegiifolium 'Album'



Thalictrum aquilegiifolium 'Album' is a graceful, clump-forming perennial to about 1–1.2 m, with soft blue-green, columbine-like foliage. In late spring it produces airy, cloud-like sprays of pure white flowers, the effect created by masses of fine, creamy stamens. Elegant and light-moving, it suits woodland edges, damp borders, or naturalistic plantings, thriving in moist, humus-rich, well-drained soil in partial shade.

Thalictrum aquilegiifolium 'My Little Favourite'



Thalictrum 'My Little Favourite' is a compact, delicately textured meadow-rue forming neat clumps of finely divided blue-green foliage. In early to midsummer it sends up airy sprays of soft lavender-pink flowers, each bloom made of fine, fluffy stamens that give a cloud-like effect. Reaching around 40–60 cm, it brings gentle movement and lightness to borders or woodland edges, thriving in moist, humus-rich, well-drained soil in partial shade.

Thalictrum aquilegiifolium 'Purpureum'



Thalictrum aquilegiifolium 'Purpureum' is a tall, architectural meadow-rue reaching 1.5–2 m, with upright stems and elegant, blue-green divided foliage. In midsummer it carries large, airy clusters of deep purple-rose flowers.

Thalictrum aquilegiifolium 'The Cloud'



Thalictrum aquilegiifolium 'The Cloud' is a refined, softly textured meadow-rue forming upright clumps of blue-green, columbine-like foliage. In late spring to early summer it produces **large, airy plumes of pale lavender-pink flowers**, the fluffy effect created by masses of fine stamens. Reaching around 1–1.2 m, it brings gentle movement and a cloud-like haze to borders or woodland edges, thriving in moist, humus-rich, well-drained soil in partial shade.

Thalictrum aquilegiifolium 'Thundercloud'



Thalictrum aquilegiifolium 'Thundercloud' is a bold, upright meadow-rue reaching around 1–1.2 m, with finely divided blue-green foliage that gives a soft, lacy texture. In late spring to early summer it produces **dense, smoky purple-rose flower plumes**.

Thalictrum aquilegiifolium var. *intermedium*



Thalictrum aquilegiifolium var. *intermedium* is an elegant, upright meadow-rue typically 1–1.2 m tall, forming loose clumps of finely divided **blue-green, columbine-like foliage**. In late spring to early summer it produces **airy plumes of soft lilac-purple stamens**, lighter and more open than the species, giving a delicate, misty haze above the leaves. Preferring **moist, humus-rich, well-drained soil** in partial shade, it adds gentle height, movement, and texture to woodland edges and natural borders.

Thalictrum aquilegiifolium var. *sibiricum*



Thalictrum aquilegiifolium var. *sibiricum* is a tall, elegant meadow-rue typically 1.2–1.5 m tall, with finely divided **blue-green, columbine-like foliage**. It bears **loose, airy plumes of soft lilac-purple stamens** in late spring to early summer, lighter and more open than the species. Native to Siberia and northern Asia, it is notably **cold-hardy**, thriving in **moist, humus-rich, well-drained soil** and partial shade, adding height, movement, and a delicate, misty texture.

Thalictrum aquilegifolium 'White Cloud'



Thalictrum aquilegifolium 'White Clouds' is a tall, airy meadow-rue reaching **1–1.5 m**, with finely divided **grey-green, columbine-like foliage** that forms a soft, lacy mound. From late spring into midsummer it lifts **large, weightless panicles of pure white, fluffy stamens**, creating a bright, cloud-like shimmer above the leaves. Dark stems add contrast, and the whole plant brings height, movement, and a luminous, ethereal quality to moist, humus-rich, partially shaded borders.

Thalictrum 'Black Stockings' AGM



Thalictrum 'Black Stockings' forms tall, elegant clumps of finely divided blue-green foliage, emerging in spring and building height through early summer. By midsummer it sends up striking dark purple-black stems topped with clouds of lavender-mauve flowers, creating a soft, floating effect. Its contrasting stems, airy texture, long flowering season and strong vertical presence make it a standout for borders and naturalistic planting.

Thalictrum 'Blizzard'



Thalictrum delavayi 'Blizzard' is a tall, elegant meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and abundant sprays of pure white flowers held on slender, wiry stems. Blooming from midsummer into early autumn, it creates a bright, cloud-like haze that moves beautifully in wind. Selected for its profuse flowering and luminous presence, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade.

Thalictrum calabricum



Thalictrum calabricum is a compact, early-flowering meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and airy clusters of soft pink-lavender flowers held on wiry stems. Emerging in spring and blooming into early summer, it brings delicate texture, light movement and reliable charm to rock gardens, gravel plantings and sunny, well-drained borders.

Thalictrum Chantilly Lace ('Mactha002')



Thalictrum 'Chantilly Lace' is a tall, elegant meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and airy sprays of soft lavender-white flowers held on strong, dark-tinged stems. Blooming from early to midsummer, it brings height, movement and a luminous, cloud-like presence to borders, thriving in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade.

Thalictrum coriaceum



Thalictrum coriaceum is a compact, slow-growing meadow-rue with firm, blue-green, leathery foliage and airy clusters of creamy-white to pale yellow flowers in early summer. Its dense, durable leaves, fine texture and neat clump-forming habit make it ideal for rock gardens, woodland edges and well-drained, humus-rich soils.

Thalictrum 'Cotton Candy'



Thalictrum 'Cotton Candy' is a tall, elegant meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and airy clouds of soft pink-lavender flowers held on strong, dark-tinged stems. Blooming from early to midsummer, it brings height, movement and a mist-like pastel haze to borders, thriving in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade.

Thalictrum dasycarpum



Thalictrum dasycarpum is a tall, graceful North American meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and airy white to pale greenish flower clusters in early summer. Its upright habit, delicate texture and tolerance of moist soils make it ideal for naturalistic plantings, wet meadows and woodland edges.

Thalictrum delavayi



Thalictrum delavayi is a tall, elegant meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and airy sprays of soft lavender-mauve flowers held on slender, wiry stems. Blooming from midsummer into early autumn, it brings height, movement and a delicate, cloud-like presence to borders, thriving in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade.

Thalictrum delavayi 'Album'



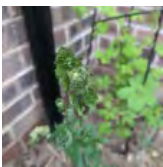
Thalictrum delavayi 'Album' is a tall, graceful meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and airy sprays of pure white flowers held on slender, wiry stems. Blooming from midsummer into early autumn, it creates a luminous, cloud-like presence that moves beautifully in wind. Ideal for adding height, delicacy and long-season interest to borders, thriving in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade.

Thalictrum delavayi 'Ankum' AGM



Thalictrum delavayi 'Ankum' is a tall, elegant meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and airy sprays of soft lavender-mauve flowers on slender, wiry stems. Blooming from midsummer into early autumn, it forms a light, cloud-like veil that moves beautifully in wind. Selected in the Netherlands near Ankum, it offers strong stems, long flowering and exceptional delicacy in moist, humus-rich soil.

Thalictrum delavayi 'Gold Laced'



Thalictrum 'Gold Laced' is a compact, finely textured meadow-rue distinguished by its blue-green foliage edged or flushed with soft golden tones in spring, maturing to green through summer. Upright stems carry airy clusters of creamy-yellow flowers in early summer. Typically 40–70 cm tall, it brings subtle colour contrast and delicate movement to lightly shaded borders and woodland edges.

Thalictrum delavayi 'Hewitt's Double' (d)



Thalictrum delavayi 'Hewitt's Double' is a tall, elegant meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and dense clusters of fully double, lavender-mauve flowers held on slender, wiry stems. Blooming from midsummer into early autumn, it forms a rich, cloud-like haze with exceptional colour depth. A long-established cultivar, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade.

Thalictrum delavayi 'Hinkley'



Thalictrum delavayi 'Hinkley' is a tall, elegant meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and airy sprays of soft lavender-mauve flowers held on slender, wiry stems. Blooming from midsummer into early autumn, it forms a light, cloud-like veil with excellent movement. Selected by plantsman Paul Hinkley for its refined habit and reliable flowering, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade.

Thalictrum delavayi var. *acuminatum*



Thalictrum delavayi var. *acuminatum* is a tall, elegant meadow-rue distinguished by its finely divided blue-green foliage and airy sprays of soft lavender-mauve flowers held on slender, wiry stems. Blooming from midsummer into early autumn, it forms a delicate, cloud-like veil with excellent movement. This variety differs from the typical species in its more elongated, acuminate leaflets and refined, open habit, thriving in moist, humus-rich soil.

Thalictrum delavayi var. *acuminatum* 'Lilac White'



Thalictrum delavayi var. *acuminatum* 'Lilac White' is a tall, elegant meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and airy sprays of soft lilac-tinted white flowers held on slender, wiry stems. Blooming from midsummer into early autumn, it forms a delicate, cloud-like veil with excellent movement. Distinguished by its acuminate leaflets and pale, bicoloured flowers, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade.

Thalictrum delavayi var. *decorum*



Thalictrum delavayi var. *decorum* is a tall, elegant meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and airy sprays of soft lavender-mauve flowers held on slender, wiry stems. Distinguished by its smaller, more neatly arranged leaflets and refined, open habit, it blooms from midsummer into early autumn, forming a delicate, cloud-like veil. Thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade.

Thalictrum delavayi var. *mucronatum*



Thalictrum delavayi var. *mucronatum* is a tall, elegant meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and airy sprays of soft lavender-mauve flowers held on slender, wiry stems. Distinguished by its small, distinctly mucronate leaflets with a tiny pointed tip, it forms a delicate, cloud-like veil from midsummer into early autumn. Thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade.

Thalictrum diffusiflorum



Thalictrum diffusiflorum is a tall, graceful species with finely divided blue-green foliage and loose, diffusely branched sprays of soft lavender-mauve flowers. Blooming from midsummer into early autumn, it forms a light, open, cloud-like veil with excellent movement. Distinguished by its widely spaced, airy inflorescences, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade.

Thalictrum dioicum



Thalictrum dioicum is a medium-sized North American meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and delicate, dangling clusters of greenish-white flowers in early spring. A true dioecious species, male and female plants differ in flower form, with males producing showier, tassel-like blooms. Ideal for woodland gardens, thriving in moist, humus-rich, lightly shaded conditions.

Thalictrum 'Elin' AGM



Thalictrum 'Elin' is a striking, architectural hybrid reaching 1.8–2.5 m, with finely divided blue-green foliage and tall, airy sprays of soft lavender-mauve flowers held on strong, dark-tinged stems. Blooming from midsummer into early autumn, it creates a dramatic, cloud-like presence with excellent movement. A vigorous, reliable hybrid of *T. rochebruneanum* and *T. flavum* subsp. *glaucum*, thriving in moist, humus-rich soil.

***Thalictrum* 'Fairy Wings'**



Thalictrum 'Fairy Wings' is a compact, graceful meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and airy sprays of soft lavender-pink flowers held on slender, wiry stems. Blooming from early to midsummer, it forms a delicate, cloud-like veil with excellent movement. Shorter and more refined than many tall *Thalictrum*, it is ideal for smaller borders and lightly shaded gardens, thriving in moist, humus-rich soil.

Thalictrum filamentosum



Thalictrum filamentosum is a medium-tall species with finely divided blue-green foliage and loose sprays of delicate, filamentous white flowers that appear in early to midsummer. The long, thread-like stamens give the plant a soft, mist-like presence with excellent movement. Native to western China, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade and brings a light, airy texture to woodland and naturalistic plantings.

Thalictrum finetii



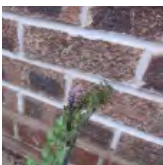
Thalictrum finetii is a medium-tall Chinese meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and loose sprays of soft lavender-mauve flowers held on slender, wiry stems. Blooming from midsummer into early autumn, it forms a light, open, cloud-like veil with excellent movement. Distinguished by its delicate inflorescences and refined foliage, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade.

Thalictrum flavum



Thalictrum flavum is a tall, moisture-loving meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and dense, upright plumes of soft sulphur-yellow flowers in early to midsummer. Strong, architectural stems and a broad, glaucous basal mound give it real presence in damp borders and meadow-style plantings. Native to Europe and western Asia, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade.

***Thalictrum flavum* 'Illuminator'**



Thalictrum flavum 'Illuminator' is a striking, moisture-loving meadow-rue grown for its brilliant yellow spring foliage, which gradually softens to chartreuse as the season progresses. Upright stems carry plumes of soft sulphur-yellow flowers in early to midsummer. A bold, luminous cultivar ideal for brightening damp borders, stream edges and naturalistic plantings in moist, humus-rich soil.

Thalictrum flavum* subsp. *glaucum



Thalictrum flavum subsp. *glaucum* is a tall, moisture-loving meadow-rue with striking blue-grey, glaucous foliage and upright plumes of soft sulphur-yellow flowers in early to midsummer. Strong, architectural stems and a broad, powder-blue basal mound give it exceptional presence in damp borders and naturalistic plantings. Thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade.

***Thalictrum flavum* subsp. *glaucum* 'Monica Lynden Bell'**



Thalictrum flavum subsp. *glaucum* 'Monica Lynden-Bell' is a tall, moisture-loving meadow-rue distinguished by its intensely glaucous blue-grey foliage and upright stems carrying soft sulphur-yellow plumes in early summer. More refined and slightly shorter than typical forms, it forms a dense basal mound and brings strong architectural presence to damp borders and meadow plantings.

***Thalictrum flavum* subsp. *glaucum* 'Ruth Lynden-bell' AGM**



Thalictrum flavum subsp. *glaucum* 'Ruth Lynden-Bell' is a tall, moisture-loving meadow-rue selected for its intensely glaucous blue-grey foliage and strong, upright stems topped with soft sulphur-yellow plumes in early summer. Distinguished from typical forms by its exceptional powder-blue leaf colour and consistently architectural habit, it excels in damp borders and naturalistic plantings.

***Thalictrum flavum* subsp. *glaucum* 'Silver Sparkler' (v)**



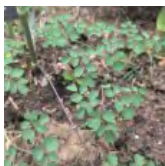
Thalictrum flavum subsp. *glaucum* 'Silver Sparkler' is a striking variegated form distinguished by its blue-grey foliage irregularly splashed and edged with creamy white. Upright stems carry soft sulphur-yellow plumes in early summer. More compact than typical forms, it forms a bright, shimmering clump ideal for damp borders, adding contrast and luminosity to naturalistic plantings.

Thalictrum foetidum



Thalictrum foetidum is a compact, clump-forming Himalayan meadow-rue with finely divided, blue-green foliage and upright stems bearing loose clusters of purple-tinged, creamy-yellow flowers in early summer. Typically 30–60 cm tall, it thrives in cool, moist, humus-rich soils. Its neat habit, fern-like leaves, and soft, nodding inflorescences make it a valuable small-scale species for woodland edges and lightly shaded borders.

***Thalictrum* 'Freefolk Purple'**



Thalictrum 'Freefolk Purple' is a tall, airy hybrid meadow-rue noted for its purple-flushed stems, finely divided blue-green foliage, and soft, creamy-yellow to pale lilac flowers in midsummer. Reaching 1.5–2 m, it brings height and movement to borders, with a distinctive dusky haze created by its tinted stems and delicate inflorescences. Best in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade.

Thalictrum ichangense



Thalictrum ichangense is a compact woodland meadow-rue forming low clumps of rounded, blue-green leaflets often marbled with silver. Slender stems carry delicate, nodding, pale lavender-pink flowers in late spring to early summer. Typically 20–35 cm tall, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in partial shade. A refined small-scale species valued for its foliage markings and subtle floral charm.

***Thalictrum ichangense* 'Evening Star' (v)**



Thalictrum ichangense 'Evening Star' is a compact woodland meadow-rue prized for its rounded blue-green leaflets marbled with silver and purple. Slender stems rise to 20–30 cm, carrying nodding lavender-pink flowers in late spring. A refined, small-scale cultivar for moist, humus-rich soil in partial shade, valued for its intricate foliage patterning and subtle floral charm.

***Thalictrum ichangense* 'Purple Marble'**



Thalictrum ichangense 'Purple Marble' is a compact woodland meadow-rue forming low clumps of rounded blue-green leaflets heavily marbled with purple and silver. Slender stems rise to 20–30 cm, carrying nodding lavender-pink flowers in late spring. A choice foliage cultivar for moist, humus-rich soil in partial shade, prized for its bold, season-long leaf patterning.

Thalictrum isopyroides



Thalictrum isopyroides is a compact Himalayan species forming neat clumps of finely divided blue-green foliage and slender stems topped with loose clusters of creamy-white to pale yellow flowers in early summer. Typically 20–40 cm tall, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in partial shade. A refined, small woodland meadow-rue valued for its delicate texture and reliable garden performance.

Thalictrum javanicum



Thalictrum javanicum is a tall, elegant tropical meadow-rue native to Southeast Asia, with finely divided, bright green foliage and airy clusters of yellow to orange staminate flowers held on slender, often reddish stems. Reaching 1.5–2.5 m in warm, moist conditions, it thrives in humus-rich, evenly moist soil in partial shade. A striking architectural species for sheltered, frost-free gardens or conservatory cultivation.

Thalictrum javanicum* var. *puberulum



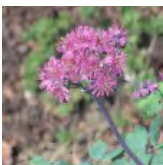
Thalictrum javanicum var. *puberulum* is a tall, elegant Southeast Asian meadow-rue with finely divided bright green foliage and slender, softly hairy stems and leaf surfaces. Large, airy panicles of yellow to orange staminate flowers appear in warm seasons. Reaching 1.5–2.5 m in humid, frost-free conditions, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in partial shade and is valued for its exotic, feathery presence.

Thalictrum kiusianum



Thalictrum kiusianum is a miniature Japanese meadow-rue forming dense mats of finely divided blue-green foliage and wiry stems topped with nodding, rich purple-violet flowers in early summer. Typically 10–20 cm tall, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in partial shade. A choice alpine-woodland species valued for its intense flower colour, compact habit, and suitability for rock gardens and troughs.

***Thalictrum* ‘Little Pinkie’**



Thalictrum ‘Little Pinkie’ is a compact, free-flowering meadow-rue forming neat clumps of finely divided blue-green foliage and slender stems topped with soft pink, airy flowers in early to midsummer. Reaching 40–60 cm, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade. A charming small cultivar valued for its delicate texture, reliable flowering, and suitability for smaller borders and naturalistic plantings.

Thalictrum lucidum



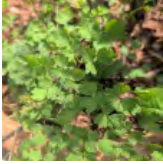
Thalictrum lucidum is a tall, upright European meadow-rue with distinctive glossy, bright green foliage and strong, reed-like stems topped with airy plumes of creamy-yellow flowers in early summer. Reaching 1.2–1.8 m, it thrives in moist, fertile soil in sun or light shade. A striking architectural species valued for its lustrous leaves, vertical habit, and refined, semi-transparent inflorescences.

***Thalictrum minus* ‘Adiantifolium’**



Thalictrum minus ‘Adiantifolium’ is a finely textured meadow-rue with exceptionally delicate, maidenhair-fern-like foliage of small, rounded blue-green leaflets. Upright stems to 60–90 cm carry airy clusters of soft yellow flowers in early summer. Thriving in moist, well-drained soil in sun or light shade, it is prized for its fern-like elegance and refined, light-catching texture.

Thalictrum minus* subsp. *guntriphookii



Thalictrum minus subsp. *guntriphookii* is a compact, finely textured meadow-rue distinguished by its small, rounded, blue-green leaflets with a unique 7-8 serrations, and upright stems bearing soft yellow, airy plumes in early summer. Typically 50–80 cm tall, it forms a slowly expanding clump and thrives in moist, well-drained soil in sun or light shade. A refined, distinctive subspecies with exceptionally delicate foliage.

Thalictrum minus* subsp. *minus

Thalictrum morisonii



Thalictrum morisonii is a slender, fine-textured meadow-rue forming upright clumps of delicate blue-green foliage and wiry stems topped with airy, pale yellow flowers in early summer. Typically 60–100 cm tall, it thrives in moist, well-drained soil in sun or light shade. A refined species valued for its filigree foliage, graceful habit, and suitability for naturalistic and meadow-style plantings.

Thalictrum morisonii* var. *mediteranium



Thalictrum morisonii var. *mediteranium* is a slender, fine-textured Mediterranean meadow-rue with narrow blue-green leaflets and wiry stems topped with airy pale yellow flowers in early summer. Typically 70–110 cm tall, it thrives in dryish, well-drained but moisture-retentive soils in sun or light shade. A graceful regional variant distinguished by its drought-tolerant habit and refined foliage.

***Thalictrum* Nimbus Pink ('Tntnp')**



Thalictrum 'Nimbus Pink' is a compact, free-flowering meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and upright stems carrying dense, airy plumes of soft pink flowers in early to midsummer. Reaching 70–100 cm, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade. A robust, modern cultivar valued for its generous flowering, refined texture, and suitability for mixed borders.

***Thalictrum* Nimbus White ('Tntnw')**



Thalictrum 'Nimbus White' is a compact, free-flowering meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and upright stems carrying dense, airy plumes of pure white flowers in early to midsummer. Reaching 70–100 cm, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade. A robust, modern cultivar valued for its luminous bloom, refined texture, and strong garden performance.

Thalictrum 'Nishiki'



Thalictrum 'Nishiki' is a compact, variegated meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green leaflets irregularly marbled and edged with creamy white. Upright stems to 40–60 cm carry soft pink to lilac flowers in early summer. Thriving in moist, humus-rich soil in partial shade, it is prized for its striking foliage patterning and delicate, airy floral display.

Thalictrum osmundifolium



Thalictrum osmundifolium is a tall, elegant East Asian meadow-rue with finely divided, fern-like blue-green foliage and upright stems topped with airy plumes of creamy-yellow flowers in early summer. Reaching 1–1.5 m, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade. A refined species valued for its *Osmunda*-like texture and graceful, semi-transparent habit.

Thalictrum petaloideum



Thalictrum petaloideum is a compact East Asian species with finely divided blue-green foliage and upright stems bearing unusually showy, petaloid white to pale yellow flowers in late spring. Reaching 40–70 cm, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in partial shade. A refined, distinctive species valued for its conspicuous sepals and elegant, woodland-edge habit.

Thalictrum petaloideum 'Ghent Ebony'



Thalictrum 'Ghent Ebony' is a compact, dark-stemmed selection of the *petaloideum* group, forming neat clumps of finely divided blue-green foliage and upright, purplish stems topped with showy, petaloid white to pale yellow flowers. Reaching 40–70 cm, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in partial shade. A striking cultivar valued for its stem colour, contrast, and refined woodland character.

Thalictrum polygamum



Thalictrum pubescens (syn. *T. polygamum*) is a tall North American meadow-rue with strong, upright stems, large blue-green leaves, and airy plumes of creamy-white flowers in midsummer. Reaching 1.5–2.5 m, it thrives in moist, fertile soils in sun or partial shade. A bold, architectural species valued for its height, texture, and naturalistic meadow presence.

Thalictrum przewalski 'Hehehe103'



Thalictrum przewalskii is a tall, elegant Chinese species with finely divided blue-green foliage and upright stems topped with airy plumes of bright yellow flowers in early summer. Reaching 1.2–1.8 m, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade. A refined, architectural meadow-rue valued for its fern-like texture and luminous, stamen-rich inflorescences.

Thalictrum pubescens



Thalictrum pubescens is a tall North American meadow-rue with strong upright stems, large blue-green leaves, and airy plumes of creamy-white flowers in midsummer. Reaching 1.5–2.5 m, it thrives in moist, fertile soils in sun or partial shade. A bold, architectural species valued for its height, transparency, and naturalistic meadow presence.

Thalictrum punctatum



Thalictrum punctatum is a slender East Asian meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and upright stems bearing loose plumes of pale yellow flowers in early summer. Typically 60–120 cm tall, it is distinguished by its small, spotted (punctate) achenes. Thriving in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or light shade, it is a refined, rarely cultivated species of botanical interest.

Thalictrum Purple Wings ('Macthapuwi')



Thalictrum 'Purple Wings' is a compact hybrid meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and upright stems carrying loose sprays of deep purple, wing-like flowers in early to midsummer. Reaching 80–120 cm, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade. A striking cultivar valued for its rich colour, airy texture, and reliable border performance.

Thalictrum 'Purplelicious'



Thalictrum 'Purplelicious' is a compact hybrid meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and upright stems carrying loose sprays of vivid purple-violet flowers in early to midsummer. Reaching 70–110 cm, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade. A striking cultivar valued for its intense colour, refined texture, and reliable border performance.

Thalictrum ramosum



Thalictrum ramosum is a tall, slender North American meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and openly branched plumes of creamy-white flowers in midsummer. Reaching 1–1.8 m, it thrives in moist, fertile soils in sun or partial shade. A graceful, lightly built species distinguished by its airy, ramosely branched inflorescences and delicate texture.

Thalictrum reniforme



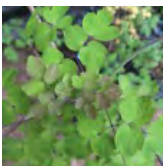
Thalictrum reniforme is a rare East Asian species with distinctive kidney-shaped basal leaflets and finely divided upper foliage. Slender stems 40–80 cm tall carry loose sprays of pale yellow flowers in early summer. Preferring moist, humus-rich soils in light shade, it is a botanically significant but scarcely cultivated species notable for its unusual reniform leaf morphology.

Thalictrum rochebruneanum AGM



Thalictrum rochebruneanum is a tall, graceful Japanese meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and airy plumes of lavender-mauve flowers carried on wiry stems in midsummer. Reaching 1.5–2.0 m, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade. A classic species valued for its height, movement, and semi-transparent, cloud-like inflorescences.

Thalictrum rochebruneanum var. *grandisepalum*



Thalictrum rochebruneanum var. *grandisepalum* is a tall Japanese meadow-rue distinguished by its larger, more persistent sepals, giving the lavender-mauve flowers a fuller, more conspicuous appearance. Reaching 1.5–2.0 m, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade. A rare botanical variety valued for its enhanced floral display and elegant, airy habit.

Thalictrum rochebruneanum 'Lavender Mist'



Thalictrum 'Lavender Mist' is a tall, elegant selection of *T. rochebruneanum*, with finely divided blue-green foliage and abundant plumes of soft lavender-mauve flowers in midsummer. Reaching 1.5–2.0 m, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade. A refined, reliable cultivar valued for its airy transparency, movement, and consistently floriferous display.

Thalictrum rubescens



Thalictrum rubescens is a medium-tall North American meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and loose plumes of creamy-white flowers in early to midsummer. Reaching 0.8–1.5 m, it is distinguished by its reddish-tinged young stems and inflorescence branches. Thriving in moist, humus-rich soils in sun or partial shade, it is a delicate, rarely cultivated species of botanical interest.

Thalictrum sachalinense



Thalictrum sachalinense is a tall East Asian meadow-rue with upright, slender stems, broad blue-green leaflets, and loose plumes of pale yellow to greenish-white flowers in early summer. Reaching 1.2–2.0 m, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soils in sun or light shade. A rare, botanically significant species valued for its height, delicacy, and broad-leafleted foliage.

Thalictrum simplex



Thalictrum simplex is a slender Eurasian meadow-rue with finely divided blue-green foliage and loose sprays of small, pale yellow-green flowers in early summer. Reaching 60–120 cm, it has thread-like stems and a very light, airy habit. Thriving in moist, well-drained soils in sun or light shade, it is a delicate, rarely cultivated species of strong botanical interest.

Thalictrum speciosissimum



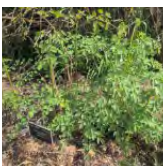
Thalictrum speciosissimum is a tall Caucasian meadow-rue with strong upright stems, broad blue-green foliage, and large, open plumes of bright yellow flowers in early summer. Reaching 1.2–2.0 m, it thrives in moist, fertile soils in sun or partial shade. A bold, rarely grown species valued for its height, luminosity, and architectural presence.

Thalictrum sphaerostachyum



Thalictrum sphaerostachyum is a rare Central Asian species with finely divided blue-green foliage and distinctive rounded, compact clusters of pale yellow flowers in early summer. Typically 40–90 cm tall, it thrives in moist, well-drained soils in sun or light shade. A botanically significant but scarcely cultivated species notable for its unusual spherical inflorescence structure.

Thalictrum 'Splendide'



Thalictrum 'Splendide' is a tall, highly floriferous hybrid with finely divided blue-green foliage and immense, cloud-like plumes of purple-mauve flowers in midsummer. Reaching 1.5–2.2 m, it thrives in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade. A dramatic, modern cultivar valued for its exceptional flower density, movement, and semi-transparent architectural presence.

***Thalictrum Splendide White* ('Fr21034'^{PBR}) AGM**



Thalictrum 'White Splendide' is a tall, highly floriferous hybrid with finely divided blue-green foliage and immense, cloud-like plumes of pure white flowers in midsummer. Reaching 1.5–2.2 m, it has strong branching and a luminous, semi-transparent habit. Thriving in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade, it is valued for its elegance, height, and cool, shimmering presence.

Thalictrum squarrosum



Thalictrum squarrosum is a rare Central Asian species with finely divided blue-green foliage and loose, outward-spreading (sugarose) clusters of pale yellow flowers in early summer. Typically 50–100 cm tall, it thrives in moist, well-drained soils in sun or light shade. A botanically significant but scarcely cultivated species notable for its distinctive sugarose inflorescence structure.

Thalictrum tuberiferum



Thalictrum tuberiferum is a rare East Asian species with a distinctive tuberous rootstock, finely divided blue-green foliage, and loose sprays of pale yellow flowers in early summer. Reaching 30–70 cm, it grows in moist, humus-rich woodland soils in light shade. A botanically important but scarcely cultivated species notable for its tuber-forming habit and delicate morphology.

Thalictrum tuberosum



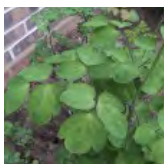
Thalictrum tuberosum is a Mediterranean meadow-rue with a tuberous rootstock, broad blue-green foliage, and loose sprays of creamy-white flowers in late spring to early summer. Reaching 40–90 cm, it thrives in sunny, well-drained, often calcareous soils. A distinctive, drought-tolerant species valued for its tubers, bold foliage, and pale, luminous bloom.

***Thalictrum 'Tukker Princess'* AGM**



Thalictrum 'Tukker Princess' is a tall, graceful hybrid with finely divided blue-green foliage and soft pastel-mauve plumes in midsummer. Reaching 1.5–2.0 m, it has airy, delicately branched inflorescences and a refined, semi-transparent habit. Thriving in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade, it is valued for its elegance, movement, and gentle colour.

Thalictrum uchiyamai



Thalictrum uchiyamae is an extremely rare Japanese woodland species with rounded blue-green leaflets and delicate sprays of pale yellow-green flowers in early summer. One of the rarest in the genus, almost never mentioned outside specialist East Asian Floras. Typically 20–40 cm tall, it forms neat clumps in moist, humus-rich soil in light shade. A botanically significant but scarcely cultivated species valued for its compact habit and refined foliage.

Thalictrum 'Ulrike'



Thalictrum 'Ulrike' is a tall, graceful hybrid with finely divided blue-green foliage and soft lilac-mauve plumes in midsummer. Reaching 1.6–2.2 m, it has airy, elegantly branched inflorescences and a refined, semi-transparent habit. Thriving in moist, humus-rich soil in sun or partial shade, it is valued for its cool pastel tones, height, and movement.

Thalictrum urbanii



Thalictrum urbanii is a rare Balkan species with rounded blue-green leaflets and airy sprays of pale yellow-green flowers in early summer. Typically 30–60 cm tall, it forms neat clumps in moist, well-drained soils in sun or light shade. A botanically significant but scarcely cultivated species valued for its compact habit and refined foliage.
